2017 Updates from:

Illinois APCO and Illinois NENA

- HB2691 & SB1381 propose to eliminate landline telephones.
 - ISSUE-More difficulty in locating callers in an emergency
 - ISSUE-Wireless phones do not always provide an accurate location
 - Affects 9-1-1 surcharge that 9-1-1 systems receive
 - Some citizens in rural areas may be left behind
- HB1894 & SB985 9-1-1 bill
 - Does not include any increase in funding (\$1.05) as recommended in the report to the General Assembly
- Statewide Funding (except City of Chicago) set at \$ 0.87 for wireline, wireless, VoIP, and Prepaid phones. Most systems receiving less funding than what was projected.
- All funding goes to the State of Illinois, through the Office of the Statewide 9-1-1 Administrator, Division of the Illinois State Police; requiring State appropriation. That **current appropriation ends on June 30, 2017.**
- Consolidation guidelines were passed that mandate consolidation of 9-1-1 dispatch centers and Emergency Telephone System Boards in counties based on population. Many consolidations are in process now.
- The Statewide 9-1-1 Advisory Board report to the General Assembly was provided on March 1, 2017.
